20th century living history programs at the Pennsylvania Military Museum began on Memorial Day Weekend 1999. Reenactors portraying L Company of the 109th Infantry Regiment, 28th Infantry Division bivouacked on the grounds that Saturday and Sunday entertaining and educating the public. Since that time the event has become a Centre Region annual event with living history "junk-on-the-bunk" tours and an afternoon combat scenario against a German recon squad.

The iconic image of 2010 is of the American's moving out of the dense French countryside. With steely determination CPL Pete Michel crosses the killing zone.

The crowd gathers before the tactical demonstration hoping to get a glimpse of the action in the thick hedgerow countryside.

The French Resistance fighter Kay Williamson scouts out the German positions.

A "man-down" is treated by the medic as the Allies move into the German positions.
